The student was staying in Veer Shiromani hostel of the campus at the time of incident. None of the students was a first-year student so this was not diagnosed to be a case of ragging. The context appears to be misunderstood by the student while he applied to a RCC. However, university administration conducted multilevel meetings to counsel the student and organize programs to convince.	This is not a case of ragging but a personal disagreement.
